

Inspiration Landing Background

- ~ 2000 RTJ Golf Trail Project proposed on TVA Reservation
- ~ 2003 John Elkington creates conceptual plan for downtown redevelopment as a Music and Entertainment District
- 2005 Elkington presents at Sheffield Redevelopment Authority Charette
- ~ 2007 River City Jack Nicklaus Golf Resort project proposed by Bill Campbell
- Sheffield Redevelopment Authority acquires property for Golf Resort
- 2008-2009 Economy tanks and capital dries up
- 2015 Bill Campbell recruits John Elkington to revive project which became Inspiration Landing

Inspiration Landing Development

- 2015 Phase I and II assessments with 1st EPA Grant
- 2016 SRA acquires Dump and Shooting Range Property
- Land Transfer and Development Agreement between the City, SRA and ILD
- Economic Impact Study Completed
- 2017 SRA awarded EPA Cleanup Grant with Categorical Exclusion
- Cleanup site enrolled in Voluntary Cleanup Program
- SRA receives State Revolving Loan Fund loan up to \$300,000
- 2018 Site Cleanup begins
- Preliminary engineering plans for public roads and utilities for Furnace Hill to Spring Creek completed

Inspiration Landing Dev. Con't

- Corridor study funded by MPO completed
- 2018 City applies for USDA Rural Development Loan
- NEPA and NHPA Section 106 triggered
- Protected Species Survey Declares Bat Habitat
- Wetlands Survey identifies wetlands cleanup modified
- Conservation consultant determines no Bat Habitat
- Cleanup activities reveal Cole and Ensley Furnaces Remnants
- Cultural Resources Surveys conducted
- Furnaces artifacts disposition negotiated with Alabama Historical Commission

Inspiration Landing Dev. Con't

- 2019 Cleanup completed. ADEM provides Conditional Letter of Concurrence. SRLF loan payment terms renegotiated.
- USDA seeks MOA with Alabama Historical Commission
- Capital Improvement Cooperative District formed
- Developer acquires metal Recycler property
- Cooperative District expanded

Furnace Hill at Inspiration Landing


- a) 4,500 seat amphitheater

- c) 25,000 sf craft brewery/distillery
- d) 150,000 sf town center
- e) 2 hotels
- f) Interpretive center
- g) An outdoor dining venue that will be known as the "The Hive," to pay tribute to the original nineteenth-century beehive kiln that will be preserved on the site
