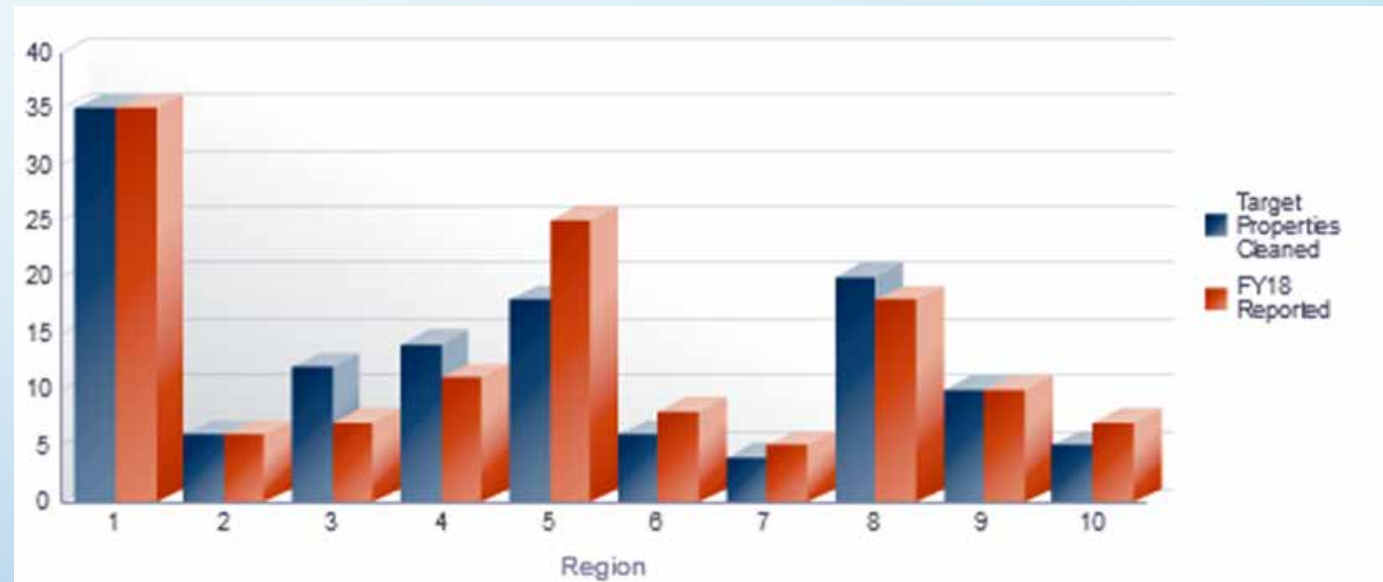

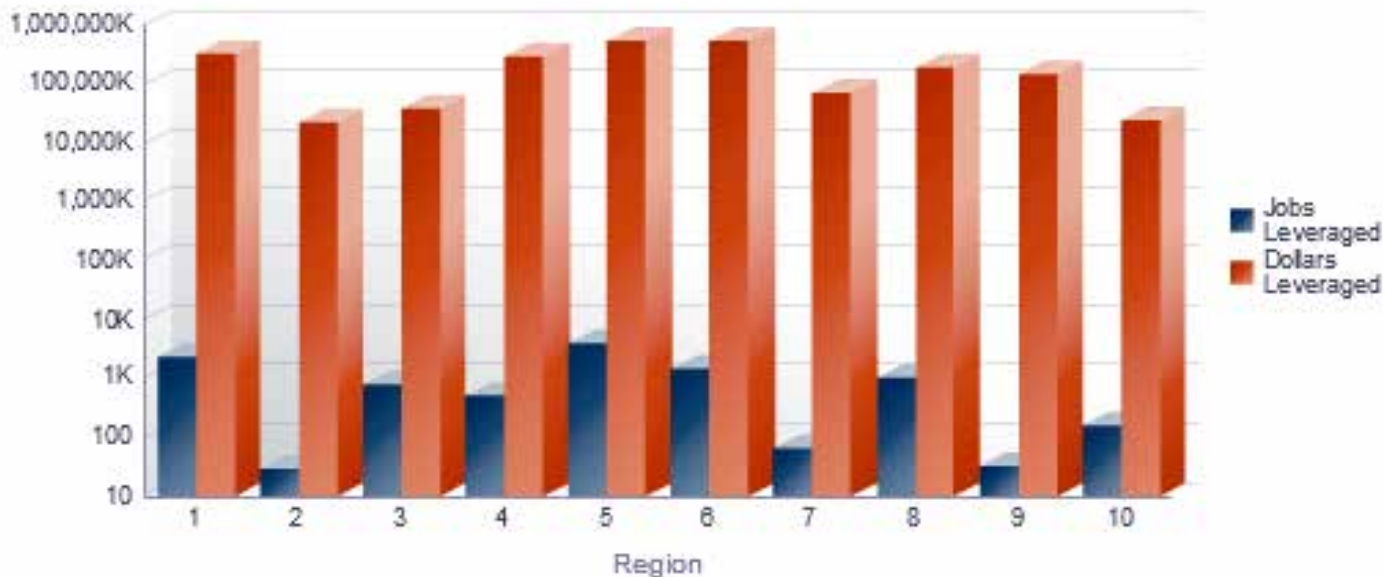

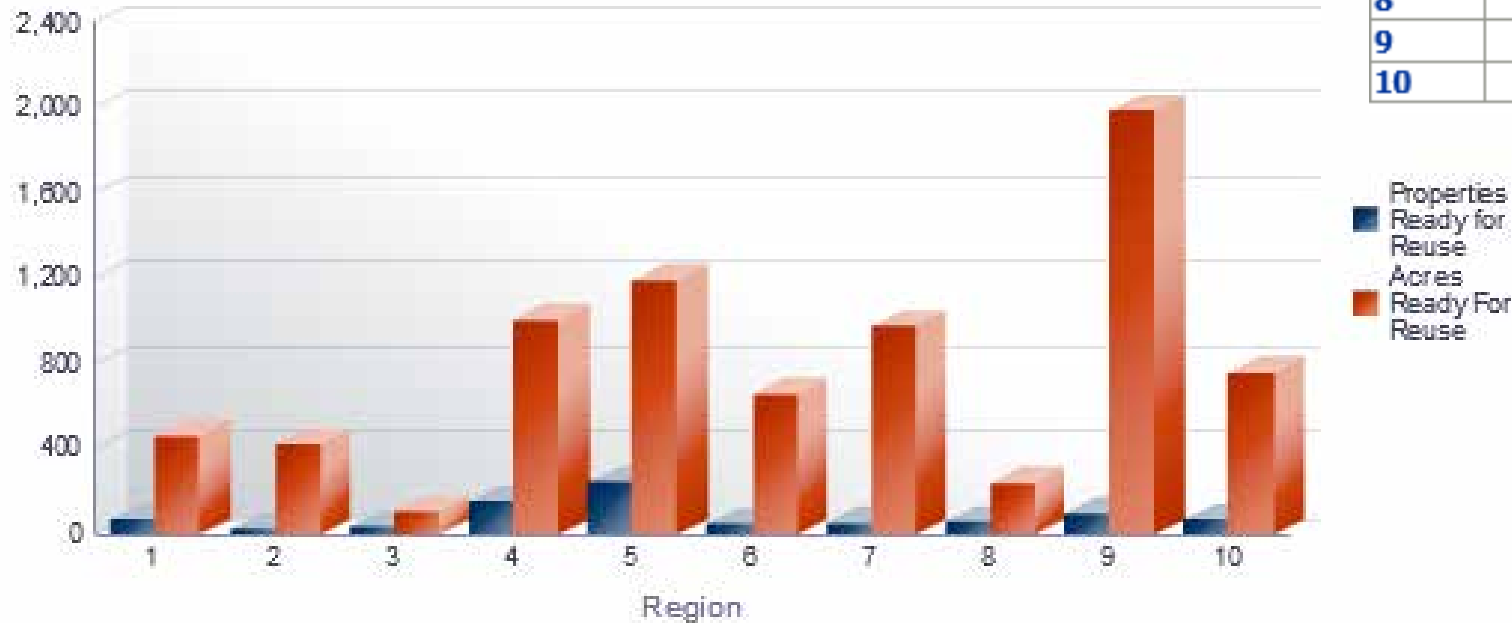

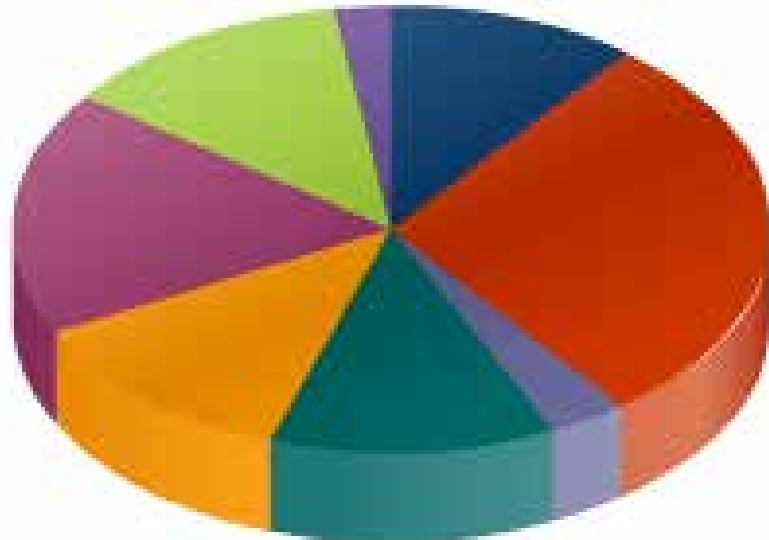

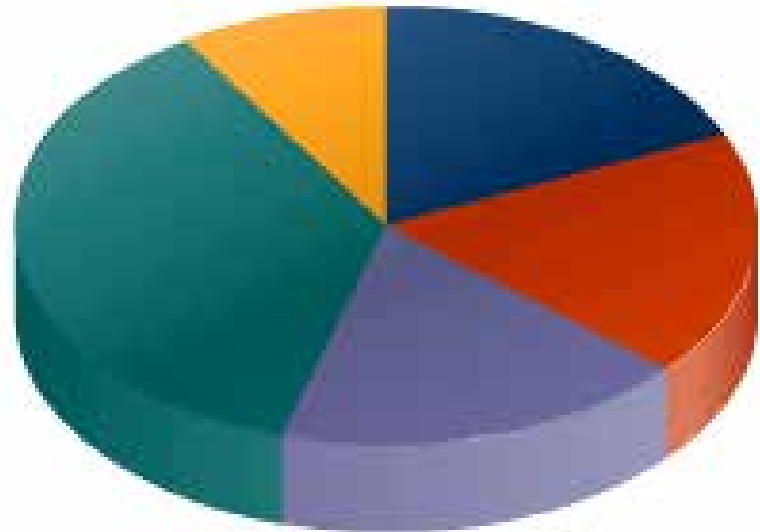

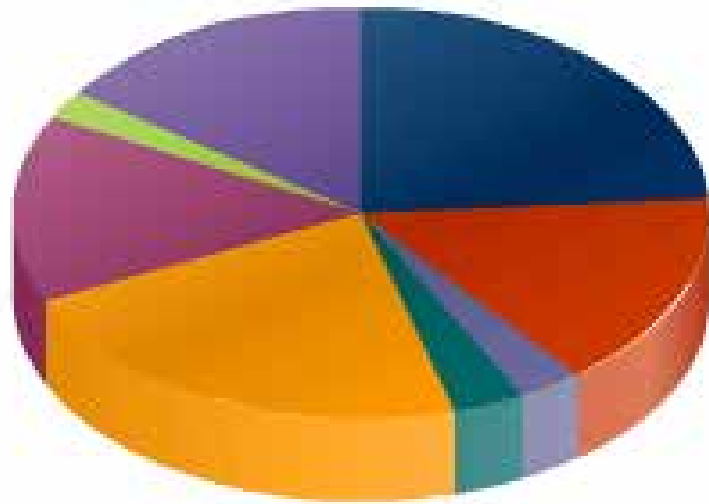
# Brownfields Accomplishments by State in FY18 – Assessments Completed
